Georgia Ministers' Retreat to feature Robert Picirilli

Dr. Robert Picirilli, former moderator of the National Association of Free Will Baptists and retired academic dean at Free Will Baptist Bible College, will speak six times at the 2011 Georgia Ministers' Retreat, according to Executive Director William Smith. The April 25-27 event meets at George T. Bagby State Park in Fort Gaines.

"This annual event is a highlight of the year for many of us," said Reverend Smith. "We expect about 40 pastors/ministers for the retreat activities. I'm delighted that our Georgia ministers will get a chance to hear one of the most respected speakers and writers in the denomination. Dr. Picirilli has done it all for Free Will Baptists—he has taught our ministers, moderated our national convention, written our books, and preached in our churches."

During the retreat, Dr. Picirilli's messages will focus on his 2007 book, *Teacher*, *Leader*, *Shepherd*: *The New Testament Pastor*. The 130-page, seven-chapter volume was published by Randall House Publications and has received broad endorse-

ments from educators and church leaders.

The 78-year-old Picirilli was converted at age 12 and ordained to preach in 1952. He served 44 years at Free Will Baptist Bible College, including duties as registrar (1960-1979), academic dean (1979-1998), and dean of the graduate school (1982-1986). His work with the National Association of Free Will Baptists includes four years as clerk (1960-1964), six years as moderator (1965-1971), and almost 40 years as a member of the Historical Commission (1973-).

A prolific writer, Dr. Picirilli has been frequently published in professional journals—*Biblical Viewpoint*, Evangelical Quarterly, Journal of the

Evangelical Theological Society, Journal for the Study of the New Testament, Baptist Quarterly and Review, Bulletin for Biblical Research, and others.

His recent books include Paul the Apostle (Moody Press), Grace, Faith, Free Will (Randall House), Understanding Assurance and Salvation (Randall House), co-translator of The Nelson Interlinear Greek New Testament (Thomas Nelson), as well as Teacher, Leader, Shepherd: The New Testament Pastor. Since 1983, he has served as general editor of the

Randall House Bible Commentary series, and wrote two of the volumes—The Gospel of Mark and 1 and 2 Corinthians—as well as parts of three other volumes

Picirilli graduated from FWBBC in 1953 with a bachelor's degree. He completed two graduate degrees at Bob Jones University—the M.A. degree in Theology (1953) and a Ph.D. in New Testament Text (1963). He is a member of the Evangelical Theological Society, a Fellow with the Institute for Biblical Research, and has served as president of the Accrediting Association of Bible Colleges (now Association for Biblical Higher Education).

Criticism — Who needs it?

Criticism is part of life. It may come from those who love us most or those who may not even like us. It may arrive like cold water poured on the flames of a great success or like stinging salt in the open wound of a setback. Have you ever seen a name pop up on your Caller ID and think; "oh no, what is it this time?" It almost seems that some people have the *gift* of criticism and feel they should *exercise* it at every opportunity.

Regardless of whether it is justified or not, receiving criticism is not normally a pleasant experience. How should we respond when we are criticized? Criticism offered with the right attitude and done in the right way can be a good thing. Criticism, when done in a constructive way to help us, may actually suggest ways to save us problems and create better situations for us.

While serving in my first pastorate, our church was growing and we desperately needed more room. Our church had a pre-school and we were in the process of expanding into a full-blown Christian school. We formed the appropriate committees and made plans to construct a new educational building and cafeteria/fellowship hall. One committee member failed to attend any planning sessions and showed up at the final session shortly before the plans were to be presented to the church. After he'd looked over the plans, I asked him; "how do you like the plans?" He responded; "I don't." My young pastoral fervor got the best of me and I snapped back; "what don't you like about them?" It upset me that he failed to attend a single planning session and now he wanted to criticize the committee's work. He then showed me a major flaw in the plans. The restrooms were where the offices needed to be and vise/versa. He was absolutely right. We changed the plans and built the new building. I learned a valuable lesson from that experience about the value of criticism

In Exodus chapter eighteen Moses' father-inlaw Jethro brings Moses' wife and two sons to join him on his journey to the promise land. After a great time of celebration, Jethro observes Moses handling his daily leadership responsibilities. He correctly discerns that Moses is trying to do too much and will burn out quickly if something doesn't change. He truly has Moses and the children of Israel's welfare at heart. Jethro first offers the criticism in verse 14 (Roy's paraphrase) Moses' father-in-law saw all that he was trying to do and ask if he realized what he was doing to these people. He goes on to tell Moses in verse seventeen that what he was trying to do was not good. He then offers Moses a suggestion to help make the situation better. In verse 21 he encourages Moses to choose good qualified men to handle the small matters and save himself for the major issues that faced the people. Moses's response provides us with a great step-by-step way of handling criticism.

Below are *four simple steps* which may be helpful as you are confronted with criticism.

Step 1 - LISTEN to it. Moses heard Jethro out. Have you been introduced to someone you didn't know and became so busy thinking about what you should say and shaking the person's hand that you totally missed the person's name? A similar thing can happen when we hear criticism. We sometimes throw up barriers because of who is delivering the criticism or simply because we are being criticized. We need to hold our tongues and listen to the details of the criticism before we speak. This does two things: 1. It helps us gain a better understanding of what we are dealing with and 2. It provides an opportunity for others to be heard. Even if we choose not to respond in the way others feel we should, they will feel that they've had a hearing. Many times just letting folks get it off their chests is all that is needed.

Step 2 - LOOK at it. Moses looked at the details of the plan Jethro had suggested. Once you've heard the criticism, thank the person for bringing it to your attention and tell them that you will certainly give it some thought. Then seriously examine the criticism/suggestion. Look at the merits of the criticism. Is this a valid criticism? Is there a problem that should be addressed? Are there changes which should be made? Is this person's suggestion the right way to go? You will then know if you should accept or reject the criticism.

Step 3 - LEARN from it. Moses recognized that Jethro was right and implemented his suggestions. If you determine the criticism to be a valid one and the suggestions for change good ones, then don't let your pride hinder you from doing what your *gut* tells you that you should. Make the changes. Move in another direction. Implement a new procedure. Stop this or start that. We never reach the place that we cannot learn from others.

Step 4 - LIVE above it. After you've *LIS-TENED* to it, *LOOKED* at it, *LEARNED* from it and the criticism is unjust or not valid, what should you do? Choose simply to *LIVE* above it. Sometimes the best response is not to respond at all. Do not spend a great deal of time rehashing the matter. Move on with life. File the criticism in the back of your mental filing cabinet and leave it there. Take the *high road* and continue doing what you're doing.

CRITICISM – Who Needs It? Criticism is part of life. It will come in times of great success and also great disappointment. It can be valid but it can also be bogus. It can be helpful and also hurtful. However it may come, we should do our best to handle it well.

Missions in the news...

Forlines resigns as IM General Director

James Forlines tendered his resignation as general director of Free Will Baptist International Missions on February 10, 2011, in agreement with the board, according to Chairman Danny Williams. "After carefully considering the challenging circumstances we are facing, the board believes a change in leadership is necessary," asserted Williams.

Forlines has a long and fruitful relationship with International Missions, as a leading supporting pastor, board member, and as general director since 1999. During his tenure, the Mission experienced rapid growth, structural reorganization, and financial development. Under Forlines' oversight the Mission has seen extraordinary overseas growth in conversions, baptisms, and churches planted. An emphasis on partnering with national leadership around the world has been a hallmark of Forlines' tenure.

Forlines has led the Mission to refocus its efforts from single-church plants to facilitating church planting movements. The Hanna Project, a nongovernmental organization which conducts humanitarian projects bringing help, hope, and healing to at risk areas, was founded in 2004, and has proven extremely successful. A set of eight core values was adopted which guided the Mission's development during Forlines' tenure.

Williams expressed the board's gratitude to Forlines and respect for his passion, integrity, and tireless efforts. "He accomplished some things no one else could have done," stated Paul Creech (GA). "As long as Christian missions exists on earth," Robert Morgan (TN) declared, "his contributions will be remembered." Randy Wilson (OK) affirmed, "We have nothing but the highest admiration and respect for James' passion and vision for world missions." His wife, Anita, has made countless sacrifices in support of James and the Mission, and the board extends special honor to

Forlines said of his time at International Missions, "I am grateful the Lord chose to use me for these years. I will greatly miss my colleagues and friends both in North America and around the world. To Him be the glory for the things that have been accomplished.

Chairman Williams confirms that veteran missionary and current Hanna Project Director Clint Morgan has agreed to serve as interim general director. The board is confident that Morgan will provide effective leadership during the transitional period. Forlines will assist with the transition. The executive leadership of the Mission will now be comprised of Morgan as interim general director, Jeff Turnbough as deputy director of field operations, and Rob Conley as director of financial

Board members attending this special session were Danny Williams (AL, chairman), Randy Wilson (OK, vice-chairman), Tom McCullough (MI, secretary), Paul Creech (GA), Nelson Henderson (AR), Jeff Manning (NC), Greg McAllister (CA), and Dr. Robert Morgan (TN). Tom McCullough was unable to attend in person, but participated in the full session via SKYPE (Internet video conference call).

McPeak resigns as deputy director

Mark McPeak, deputy director of stateside operations, submitted his resignation to General Director James Forlines on January 19, 2011. "Regretfully, I accepted Mark's resignation...after asking him to give it further consideration," stated Forlines. "Mark has maintained a key role in his years here. He came at a strategic time and helped the Mission work through critical issues. He has been an advisor

McPeak indicated several circumstances brought him to the point of tendering his resignation. He had been asked to shoulder the responsibility of development tasks—a role for which he felt ill equipped. With the reduced office staffing, he expressed his firm belief that a development director is a more immediate need than a deputy director during this financially challenging time. He struggled with the implications of this reality and, "After much prayer and consideration,"

"the unsolicited offer of another position seemed a providential opportunity from the Lord."

"From my human perspective," Forlines acknowledged, "this is a real loss, but God knows what He is doing.' Temporarily, Clint Morgan will join the stateside team for six to nine months. He



will return to the States February 10 and will spearhead fundraising efforts. Morgan will initially concentrate on coordinating the World Missions Offering in April.
"Working at IM has been one of the most

gratifying and enjoyable experiences of my life. I will greatly miss the home office staff, the leadership team, our missionaries, and our national partners," McPeak declared. "I will be praying for and supporting the work

McPeak's tenure as deputy director with IM will end on February 15, 2011. However, he desires to stay connected with the Mission and will join the Advisory Council. "He has also graciously agreed to consult with me as needed," stated Forlines

Mark will join a marketing and communications firm in middle Tennessee. He joined the International Missions staff in April 2005 as director of communications. In April 2008, his role expanded to deputy director of stateside operations.



McVays return stateside for special assignment

Sam and June McVay, missionaries to Spain, will return to the States on February 17, 2011, to assist the International Missions staff. Scheduled for a six-month stateside assignment beginning in June 2011, the couple was asked to return to the States early. Sam will focus on promoting the World Missions Offering over the next few months. June will supplement the reduced office staff with her organizational and clerical skills.

"The McVays' flexibility and readiness to be used where most needed is a tremendous asset to the Mission," stated Interim General Director Clint Morgan. "Initially, I was to fill the role Sam will occupy. I, personally, am grateful for Sam's

willingness to put aside his plans and assist the Mission at this critical time."

The ambassador team set the goal for the 2011 World Missions Offering (WMO) at \$650 thousand. "The grave financial situation facing the Mission necessitates a healthy WMO," according to Director of Financial Operations Rob Conley. "Obviously, this can only occur with concerted effort and direction."

"I look forward to augmenting the work of the ambassadors as represent the throughout the denomination," Sam declared. "Their diligence and tireless efforts have led to substantial increases in the WMO in recent them, reach churches they cannot, and extend their ongoing endeav-

The annual World Mission Offering is scheduled for Easter Sunday, April 24, 2011. "The Free Will Baptist denomination is comprised of a great group of people. I am confident our churches and people will rise to the present challenge and keep our missionaries on task in their countries of service," Morgan said.

Sam and June will tackle their temporary roles on February 18. Following the April offering, the McVays will transition into their stateside assignment. They plan to return to Spain on January 3, 2012.


